Stanley would have an early taste of working-class life, studying part-time through the University of South Africa (UNISA) to join the audit and accounting profession and qualifying as a Chartered Accountant (SA) in 1987. He was appointed audit partner at PricewaterhouseCoopers and served a number of the firm's large clients both in the public and private sectors.

In 1998 he was appointed as Corporate Finance Leader for PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) in KwaZulu Natal. He was involved in a number of due diligences, mergers and acquisitions and concluded several large funding transactions on behalf of clients. During this time, he also lectured part time in auditing, internal auditing, and accounting and later tax and was an external moderator for the advance accounting modules.

At the age of 42 he was appointed Deputy CEO for PwC Southern Africa and member of the Southern Africa executive committee ("Exco"). This propelled him into the upper echelons of the South African and global business sector. He carried out the following leadership roles at PwC from 2001 to 2015:

He took early retirement from PwC on 30 June 2015 and is currently the Group CEO of Menston Holdings (Pty) Ltd, an investment holding company. He is a non-executive director for the Nedbank Group and Chairman of the Group Audit Committee. He is Chairman of UViRCO Technologies and Chairman of the Audit Committee for the Terrasan Gro

The insight gained from being a member of the PwC Africa Leadership Team since inception, has given him the opportunity to interact with the rest of the firm's offices across the world and has given him exposure to many corporate and political leaders.

He was the Chairman of Business Skills for South Africa Foundation, a non-profit organisation that has trained over 18000 entrepreneurs from disadvantaged communities on business skills. He was the Chairman of the Nepad Business Foundation – a Pan African business foundation that seeks to put Africa on a path of sound sustainable economic development. He is a regular participant at the World Economic Forum (Africa chapter).

He has addressed various media and the leading daily business publications on a wide range of topics. A sought after speaker at many local and global forums, conferences and executive briefing sessions on a broad range of topics, He has participated as a member of the Presidential Working Group that meets with the South African President and senior Government Ministers to discuss matters affecting business in South Africa as well as accompanied the President and Ministers on foreign investment missions promoting South Africa as an investment destination.
